The Integrated Domestic and Family Violence Services (IDFVS) program provides women and their children with the emotional and practical support they need to recover from domestic and family violence. The program empowers women to keep themselves and their family safe if they stay in their home or to devise a 'safety plan' so they can leave if they choose. The program also supports people who decide to pursue the prosecution of someone who has abused them through the courts. In addition, IDFVS helps to find the right therapeutic support for children.

When you call the Domestic Violence Line, the call will be answered by a trained female caseworker. The caseworker will be sensitive to the needs of women who have experienced domestic and family violence. You can ring as often as you need to at any time, day or night. The female caseworker will listen to you. She won't blame you or make you do anything you don't want to do. She can give you information on what you can do and help you decide on your options. Domestic Violence Line staff are aware of the needs of Aboriginal women and women from other cultures, as well as women living in rural and remote areas. Available 24 hours. SAHSSI's Case Manager will help clients to develop personal case plans, which will assist in achieving their goals. The Case Manager works in collaboration with the client to identify strengths, respond to issues and work towards strategic and action based goals. SAHSSI's case management can include:

- *outreach support to people with tenancies at risk (including tenancies at risk due to the impacts of domestic and family violence)*
- *clients who have multiple identified issues, such as Alcohol and Drug, Mental Health, Physical Health, Disability (up to 12-18 months support)*
- *information and advice can also include linking you with NSW Police domestic and violence liaison officers, safety audits in the home, resources on digital and tech safety planning, referrals for financial support for safety devices (Victim Services or Corrective Services), referral to Staying Home Leaving Violence program.*
